
Dear Dr. Andrews:

Thomas P. Boehm is currently an Assistant Professor of Real Estate and Urban Development in the Department of Finance at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, 37916. Since joining the UT faculty in September, 1979, his instructional responsibilities have included the following:

Undergraduate Level:

Principles of Real Estate
Urban Economics (two-quarter series)

Master's Level:

Economics of Housing and Land Markets

Besides continuing as an instructor in these areas, the applicant is interested in development/instruction of courses dealing with Real Estate Finance/Investment/Appraisal.

Dr. Boehm has published recent articles in The AREUEA Journal, The Journal of Urban Economics, and Urban Studies. Past research topics included (1) Household's mobility and tenure decisions, and (2) the investment demand for owner-occupied housing. Current research deals with the effects of inflation on families' housing adjustments.
